Girls Only Club is for girls in ninth- through twelfth-grade and is part of the Teen Girl Ministries branch of the national Girls Ministries Department. Girls Only Club was developed to specifically meet the spiritual and social needs of high school girls.

Girls Only Club material is designed to help these young girls learn accountability — to God, to their families, to their friends. The units provided will help girls make God's truths and values the focus of their lives. The curriculum features discussion-oriented lessons to continue the Titus 2 principle of women mentoring young girls.

Girls Only and Youth Group

Girls Only Club meetings can be held at any time of the week. Girls need not be torn between Girls Only Club and youth group activities. Girls Only can meet on any night different from Youth night or used in conjunction with Youth ministry as a small group discipleship tool for girls.

Unit Structure and Achievement Requirements

Girls Only Club is a 4-year program. In order to be a Girls Only graduate, girls need to complete 20 units (5 each year) during their time in Girls Only. Each unit has 6 lessons and can be completed in as few as 6 weeks. When girls complete a unit, they wear a clutch-back pin representing each unit's artwork. In order to complete a unit (and earn a charm), girls will need to complete the unit *Journal* pages, memorize the unit memory verse and central truth, and complete a unit project.

Becoming a Girls Only Graduate

The final requirement to become a Girls Only Graduate is completion of the comprehensive Girls Only Club Review — a fill-in-the-blank test over the 20 memory verses and central truths of the units completed, the club distinctives, and the "Statement of Faith."

Completion of unit requirements, the Girls Only Review, and reading the entire Bible will make a girl eligible to be a Girls Only Graduate. Girls Only Graduates are awarded a Girls Only Graduation necklace which we recommend churches find locally to fit their budgets.
